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Introduction

What is 'national identity' and what does it mean to 'belong' to a certain state? What is the relationship between individual and collective identity? What is the relationship between the *state* and the *nation*?

Is 'national identity' simply invented by leaders to instill patriotism or legitimize certain policies while they are essentially consumed by material struggles for power? Or does 'national identity' itself provide the 'symbolic resources' within which leaders must act to live up to an 'ideal' image of the state and resonate with their citizens? What happens when societies have multiple, and often times, competing layers of 'national identity'?

This course aims at introducing participants to the theoretical and conceptual issues, dilemmas, and debates involved in the study of national identity. It also aims at surveying the historical trajectory of state-building in light of contemporary challenges and opportunities. The course will examine how different variables can often act as catalysts for the development of a cohesive national identity amidst the existence of multiple domestic, regional, and international challenges.

Objectives

By the end of this course practitioners shall learn to:

- Establish a firm grasp of the theoretical and conceptual issues related to the study of nationalism.
- Understand the historical and socio-political forces involved in the trajectory of state-building.
- Evaluate the challenges and opportunities involved in the establishment of a cohesive national identity.
- Compare and contrast different case studies of national identity.
