- Learn the purpose, types, and risk management of Letters of Guarantee (LG).

- Gain insights into Trust Receipts (TR) and their role in trade financing.
- Examine various short-term financing facilities, including overdrafts, import loans, and export loans.
- Develop risk assessment and mitigation strategies in trade finance.
- Apply knowledge through case studies and real-world scenarios.

 - Process flow under URC 522
 - Advantages and risks compared to LCs

Day 3: Trust Receipts (TR) & Short-Term Financing

 - Definition and purpose in trade finance
 - How TRs facilitate inventory financing
 - Risks and safeguards for banks
- Short-Term Financing Facilities:
 - Overdraft facilities features and suitability
 - Working capital loans for traders

- Import Loans:
 - Pre-import and post-import financing
 - Structuring loans based on LC terms
- Export Loans:
 - Pre-shipment and post-shipment financing
 - Financing against export documents
- Case studies on structuring trade loans
